



Guide to Managing Requests from NHS providers outside of Surrey Heartlands when there is a conflict between the status of a drug on the Prescribing Advisory Database (PAD) and the formulary used by the non-Surrey Heartlands provider

Introduction

There may be occasions when requests to prescribe certain medicines identifies a conflict between the status of the medicines on the host's formulary compared to the status within Surrey Heartlands as indicated on the <u>Prescribing Advisory Database</u> (PAD). If this situation occurs, the tables below provide some guidance on the actions that could be considered to assist practices in deciding whether they should accept responsibility for prescribing. If in any doubt, please contact your local Medicines Optimisation team. It is expected that Trusts that are represented on the Surrey Heartlands APC as Members or Associate Members should follow Surrey Heartlands' pathways and guidelines for patients registered to Surrey Heartlands' general practices.

How to use the tables:

Each table refers to the status of the medicine in the non-Surrey Heartlands provider formulary:

Table 1	Non-formulary or not evaluated
Table 2	RED status (hospital only)
Table 3	AMBER status (shared care)
Table 4	BLUE status (initiated and stabilised by specialist before transfer to primary care OR initiated in primary care following
	recommendation by specialist). Note: some external organisations may use terms such as AMBER 1 / AMBER 2 to describe this status.
Table 5	GREEN status

Select the table relevant to the status in the non-Surrey Heartlands Provider formulary and read across to match the status on the Surrey Heartlands PAD.

The document makes reference to "robust governance arrangements." This may be in the form of a shared care document, but if this is not available, any provided documentation should have been through the host commissioner's governance processes, and provides sufficient information about the drug and clinical responsibility to enable the GP practice to make an informed decision.
