## ONS Prescribing 'Dos and Don'ts'

DOs			DON'Ts				
<b>√</b>	Prescribe a <b>minimum of 600kcal/day</b> initially (usually 2 servings, prescribe between meals).	•	Powdered ONS should not be prescribed for renal patients with electrolyte imbalances (usually CKD 4/5). Contact a dietitian for more advice.				
<b>✓</b>	Prescribe ONS as <b>acute</b> NOT repeat prescriptions.	(	Powdered ONS should not be prescribed for patients with cow's milk intolerance or galactosemia, or as a sole source of nutrition.				
✓	Review ONS prescriptions every 3 months as a minimum. If patients fail to engage or do not attend two consecutive ONS reviews the ONS prescription should be stopped and the patient informed.	(	ONS should not automatically be continued when patients are discharged from hospital on ONS, unless correspondence is received from a dietitian.				
<b>✓</b>	Initially prescribe an <b>ONS starter pack</b> or <b>one week's supply</b> in a variety of flavours to help people identify their preferred flavours.	<b>x</b>	Do not prescribe ONS on a PRN basis.				
✓	Promote a <b>'Food First'</b> approach by providing the local resources from the <u>Surrey PAD</u> .		Patients who are substance misusers should not routinely be prescribed ONS, unless they meet ACBS criteria.				
✓	The <b>Malnutrition Universal Screening Tool (MUST)</b> should be used to identify those who are malnourished or at nutritional risk before initiating ONS prescription <i>(online MUST calculator available here)</i> .		As directed' should not be used on prescription directions: provide clear directions for use, e.g., 'twice daily, 1 hour after meals'.				
✓	Assess <b>underlying causes</b> of malnutrition and consider treatment options.

Only prescribe the products below following nutritional assessment and recommendation by a registered dietitian in line with ACBS indications. Other supplements may be requested, based on a dietitian's professional judgement, to meet the requirements of individual patients. This must be clearly justified in a prescription request.
