

## Prescribing Clinical Network

Policy Statement	Collagenase clostridium histolyticum (CCH, Xiapex®) for treating Dupuytren's Contracture (NICE TA459)
Policy No:	PCN 278 - 2017

Review Date:	October - 2020 (Unless new published evidence becomes available before this date OR there is new published national guidance e.g. NICE)

## Recommendations:

The PCN recommends collagenese clostridium histolyticum (CCH, Xiapex®) for treating Dupuytren's Contracture in line with NICE TA459.

For people not taking part in the ongoing clinical trial, CCH (Xiapex®) is recommended as an option for treating Dupuytren's contracture with a palpable cord in adults only if all of the following apply:

- There is evidence of moderate disease (functional problems and metacarpophalangeal joint contracture of 30° to 60° and proximal interphalangeal joint contracture of less than 30° or first web contracture) plus up to 2 affected joints.
- Percutaneous needle fasciotomy (PNF) is not considered appropriate, but limited fasciectomy is considered appropriate by the treating hand surgeon.
- The choice of treatment (CCH or limited fasciectomy) is made on an individual basis after discussion between the responsible hand surgeon and the patient about the risks and benefits of the treatments available.
- One injection is given per treatment session by a hand surgeon in an outpatient setting.

Xiapex® is a payment by results excluded drug and will be considered RED on the traffic light system.
