

Disposal of Clinical /Healthcare Waste generated in a patient's home.

This document is intended as a reference source for Health Care Professionals in primary care. It may also be useful to patients and carers for information.

The guidance covers the disposal of healthcare/clinical waste (including cytotoxic) generated in a patients' home as a result of a patient treating themselves. This waste is considered to belong to the patient and they are responsible for the disposal of this waste. Waste arising from administration by a healthcare professional should be disposed of by following the standard procedures of the provider organisation.

Healthcare/clinical waste includes:

- Medicines
- Non- hazardous clinical waste
- · Hazardous clinical waste
- Sharps

Medicines (excluding sharps)

Unwanted and out of date medicines can be taken to the local pharmacy. This includes inhalers, both used and unused, many of which contain greenhouse gases. Inhalers returned to pharmacies for safe disposal can be disposed of with other medicines waste. This is thermally treated to destroy the greenhouse gases. Further information regarding the disposal of medicines at local pharmacies, can be found on the PSNC website <u>Disposal of unwanted medicines: PSNC Main site</u> Medicines should NOT be disposed of with general household waste or via the drainage system. See local borough/council information regarding recycling of packaging and containers.

Non-hazardous clinical waste

Healthcare waste that is not hazardous or infectious can be put in your normal rubbish bin. This includes:

- dressings and bandages
- incontinence pads
- sanitary products
- stoma bags (emptied)
- catheter waste (after contents has been disposed of in a toilet)
- 'peg' or stomach feeding equipment
- home dialysis waste (empty saline or glucose IV bags and tubing)

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You may wish to double bag the waste before disposal. If you have an infectious illness or are undergoing treatment with cytotoxic or cytostatic drugs, such as chemotherapy, then the items listed above may be hazardous and need to be collected separately as hazardous clinical waste

Hazardous clinical waste

Hazardous clinical waste should NOT be disposed of in the household rubbish bin. This may include swabs and wound dressings/bandages that are contaminated with infectious or hazardous substances, wound vacuum drains or pumps and home dialysis waste (except empty saline or glucose IV bags, which can go in your rubbish bin)

You will need to dispose of this waste in different coloured bags/sharps boxes/bins and collection will need to be organised via the borough/council.

All cytotoxic medication/waste must be disposed of in a 'purple lidded' sharps box/ specific purple bag, in order to comply with guidance and relevant legislation. If a patient is attending hospital as an outpatient, cytotoxic waste may be accepted by the hospital. Please confirm details with the relevant hospital. The hospital may supply cytotoxic sharp boxes if the council is unable to supply them.

Sharps (including cytotoxic)

Sharps (medical devices, such as needles or lancets which can cut or pierce the skin) should NOT be disposed of in the household rubbish bin. Sharps should be placed in special sharps boxes/bins for separate collection, even if they are not contaminated or have not been used. If boroughs/councils do not supply sharps boxes, Needle Clipping Devices and Sharps Boxes (Sharpsafe® or Sharpsguard® or SharpsSafety®) are available to prescribe on FP10 prescription (please refer to the Drug Tariff: http://www.nhsbsa.nhs.uk/PrescriptionServices/4940.aspx)

Contact your local pharmacy if you are unsure if the clinical waste is hazardous.

Each borough or district council has specific arrangements regarding Clinical Waste Disposal. Below is a list of services available from the listed borough councils. Please contact your local council for further information. Collections of hazardous clinical waste need to be arranged through the local council.

Once you have requested this service, collections will continue on a fortnightly basis. Replacement clinical waste bags and sharps bins are not available
