•	Use simple measures first, including advising people over 1 year with cough to take honey. The dose is 1 teaspoon of honey.  Consider short-term use of codeine linctus, codeine phosphate tablets or morphine sulfate oral solution in people 18 years and over to suppress coughing if it is distressing. •	Advise people to take <b>paracetamol or ibuprofen</b> if they have fever and other symptoms that antipyretics would help treat.  Tell them to continue only while both the symptoms of fever and the other symptoms are present	No local guidance

Ar	Antibiotics		
•	Do not use antibiotics for preventing or treating COVID-19. Only use antibiotics if there is strong clinical suspicion of additional bacterial infection If a person has suspected or confirmed secondary bacterial pneumonia, start antibiotic treatment as soon as possible.
