Re: Prescribing of Low Molecular Weight Heparins (LMWH) pre-operatively

Dear Colleague,

The pharmaceutical commissioning team in NHS Surrey recently completed a piece of work in producing an amber* proforma to support GPs in the on-going prescribing of treatment dose LMWH in specific patient cohorts. Following on from this NHS Surrey received a number of queries from GPs in relation to the prescribing of LMWH pre-operatively in patients that are usually maintained on warfarin.

I have been in contact with the Department of Health regarding this and they have confirmed the following:

'Where a drug is <u>not</u> excluded from Payment by Results then it is included within it unless it is part of an excluded service. This would include drugs that a patient is switched to in anticipation of surgery'.

NHS Surrey would therefore expect if a patient requires to be switched to a LMWH prior to surgery that this would be prescribed by the Acute Trust concerned and that the GP should not be requested to prescribe.
