The Prescribing Clinical Network does not recommend the use of once daily tadalafil	
<ul> <li>De-prescribe once daily tadalafil in all patients in line with NHS England guidance</li> <li>Key Considerations:</li> <li>NHS England guidance 'Items which should not routinely be prescribe in primary care: Guidance for CCGs' - <u>https://www.england.nhs.uk/wp-content/uploads/2017/11/items-which-should-not-be-routinely-precscribed-in-pc-ccg-guidance.pdf</u></li> <li>Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia: NICE terminated their technology appraisal (TA273) due to receiving no evidence from the manufacturer. In NICE CG97: Lower Urinary Tract Symptoms in Men. NICE state that there is not enough evidence to recommend phosphodiesterase inhibitors in routine clinical practice.</li> <li>Erectile Dysfunction: PrescQIPP have reviewed the evidence for Tadalfil and</li> </ul>	
although tadalafil is effective in treating erectile dysfunction, there is not enough evidence to routinely recommend once daily preparations in preference to "when required" preparations. <u>https://www.prescqipp.info/tadalafil-drop-list/category/297-tadalafil-once-daily-drop-list</u>
