Policy Statement	Aralax suppositories for constipation
Policy No:	PCN 78-2013
Date of Issue	27 th November 2013
Review Date:	November 2015 (Unless new published evidence becomes available before this date OR there is new published national guidance e.g. NICE)

Recommendations:

The PCN does not routinely support the use of Aralax suppositories for constipation and this should be considered as **BLACK** on the traffic light system.

Key Considerations:

- Aralax is an unlicensed stimulant laxative occasionally used for patients with MS and spinal injuries
- There is a lack of robust evidence supporting the use of this product and there are no national guidelines available recommending this product
- As Aralax is unlicensed the cost of obtaining as a "special" is significantly higher than compared with the licensed preparations of bisocodyl suppositories 5mg or 10mg
